Minutes from the April 27, 2015 Meeting were reviewed and approved. MSC Thomas/Fleming

Programs for First Read

- Copper Mountain College (Kersey/Friedt) presented six new Certificates of Achievement in their Automotive program:
 1. Automotive Technology (32-33 units)
 2. Alternative Fuel Vehicles (20 units)
 3. Transmission Service, Repair and Overhaul (20 units)
 4. (Automotive) Air Conditioning and Heating Service and Repair (16 units)
 5. Engine Performance and Driveability (20 units)
 6. Steering and Suspension Service (16 units)

Discussion: Perkins advisory committee felt it would be helpful to have certificates as they currently only have AS degree in automotive. Previously had small unit certificates. Question: Are these in alignment with any other regional programs? No. They are in the process of seeking NATEF certification and will investigate aligning their programs to NATEF certification.

Action: Approved for first read. M/S/C Yamamoto/Fleming

- Chaffey College (Boyd) presented their certificated in Homeland National Security.

Discussion: Developed from the existing TSA certificate they currently offer through contract education. May seek an associate degree in the future depending on interest/enrollment of students. Question: Does Chaffey have a police academy? No, fire only.

Action: Approved for first read. M/S/C Turnier/Thomas

- San Bernardino Valley College (Maniaol) presented their certificate in Computer Network Support Specialist.

Discussion: Purpose is to add to the various IT programs already being offered at Valley and have something in networking to offer students. No advisory recommendation in packet. Must show advisory recommendation at the second read. Suggest changing award to add associate degree in addition to certificate. Concern: Only one CISCO course is offered and the program title may lead potential students to believe it is more networking. No alignment with other regional CISCO networking programs. Albert indicated courses are aligned with O*Net job specs.

Action: Recommend postponing first read action until the October meeting so that Valley faculty can address concerns. M/S/C Maniaol/Avila

There were no programs presented for second read.

Discussion / Informational Items

- CCCAOE regional VP, Kevin Fleming, provided an updated. Spring Conference will be held April 20-22 in Sacramento. Hyatt is the CCCAOE hotel and he recommended securing hotel accommodations quickly as it will likely fill up fast. This will be a joint conference with CIO, Academic Senate, and Student Services. It was suggested to Kevin that sessions be announced at time of registration as it helps CTE deans encourage others to attend. Kevin will bring this feedback back to the board.
- DSNs and other key talent joined the meeting at 9:15 a.m.
 - SB1070 project director, Susanne Mata, presented Academic Senate C-ID Proposal. They are seeking interested regions to participate in this project. Discussion ensued and the following were proposed as possible sectors for this work: Healthcare, Advanced Manufacturing, ICT, Public Safety, and Automotive. Automotive and CISCO were suggested because both are aligned with industry certifications. Also suggested connection with one or more of the pilot BA programs being offered through community colleges.
 - Robert: November 4 Trade Export Summit in Desert @ Hyatt. Nov 10-11 Model United Nations.
 - Alan: BIW Update handed out marketing materials. Kevin mentioned there will be confusion on the part of students regarding the difference between a pathway to success vs. certificate so they will not be marketing this on their campus. Hope to have statewide certificate done in the next couple of months.
 - Ken: Earn and Learn—focusing on apprenticeships as Machinists, Industrial Maintenance Mechanics, Control Systems Technologists. Must be driven by industry. Can be compensated as FTE or RSI. Chaffey is applying for apprenticeship grants (innovation and pre-apprentice).
